

Troop 39 Code of Conduct

We recognize that for boys to grow to responsible men, they need to be held accountable for their actions. Therefore, any scout who intentionally participates in an activity that has the potential to cause harm to him or other troop members, or behaves in a manner that reflects negatively upon Troop 39 or the Boy Scouts of America, will be disciplined. Behavior that is cause for disciplinary action is outlined in the Discipline Policy Procedures and includes, but is not limited to the following:

- Not following the Scoutmaster's or leader's (youth and adult) orders or directions.
- Significantly unsafe actions - endangers himself or others.
- Exploring physical hazards without permission and supervision (lakes, creeks, cliffs, etc.).
- Leaving designated areas without the Scoutmaster's or leader's permission.
- Use of cursing or foul language.
- Excessively rowdy, unruly, loud, disrespectful, disobedient or disruptive behavior.
- Physical or verbal hazing or harassment of others.
- Use of any controlled or illegal substance.
